RESEARCH

Abstract(s):

Master's Research: My master's research entailed studying the availability/accessibility of international study abroad for college and university students in the U.S.A. I researched study abroad programs, virtual/distance education, and the inequity of travel opportunities for minority college students. I integrated distance learning technology to propose an equitable, virtual alternative for minority students who otherwise cannot travel abroad due to disability, lack of funding, or time commitments such as maintaining a job or taking care of grandparents, parents, or siblings. My solution is called a Virtual Intercultural Learning Experience (VIntLE), which provides students online access to intercultural learning materials comparable to a Virtual Exchange or Global Virtual Team experience.

Assistantship Research: My assistantship research involved qualitatively studying the impact of effective mentorship on newly hired Extension Agents in the state of Florida. My co-researchers and I determined that effective leadership is critical in employee retention, development, and success. We noted how ineffective leadership and mentorship with newly onboarded Extension Agents resulted in lower job satisfaction, higher Agent turnover, and reports of feeling dispensable or not valued by the institution. We proposed a reformed mentorship program to hold leaders more accountable for the development and training of new Extension Agents during their first 3 years on the job.
